4.1.2 Read 180 will no longer be funded because Houghton-Mifflin will no longer service the older version of the program; new program is very costly. So teachers will try to hold true to the model but build a new reading program of our own. Now called “Reading”.

4.1.3 Actively interviewing for math, cross-cat, and reading

4.2 *Scheduling - geared toward intervention, possibly “banding”*

4.3 *CIP – Critical thinking daily/multiple opportunities, Data, Communicating with families*

4.3.1 301 money is determined by CIP, Evaluations, and Teacher Growth Plan

4.3.2 CIP presented on May 10th. If it passes, that portion of the 301 monies will be covered.
